YOU SAID/YOU DID With thanks to the 67 parents/carers who took the time to complete the March Parent/Carer Survey. We are proud to note the positive aspects many of you identified in your responses. We are pleased to hear that the majority of our learners feel happy and safe at school, a testament to the nurturing environment we strive to create. Parents appreciate the school's efforts in communication, with many agreeing or strongly agreeing that the school communicates effectively. However, some comments suggest room for improvement in the frequency and clarity of communication. Some comments suggest that parents/carers are looking for more opportunities to be involved in school activities and decision-making processes. Therefore, we will be launching our Parent Partnership which ceased in 2021 due to a lack of uptake from parents - we are really keen to reform, ready for September 2024.
