DOMESTIC ABUSE

ADAPT (Accredited Domestic Abuse Prevention Training)

Description

20-week face-to-face group programme, that works with individuals who have used or are using unhealthy behaviours in an intimate relationship, and we deliver a series of interventions to help reduce the risks of domestic abuse. This programme is for men aged 18+ who want to change their abusive behaviour towards a partner and addresses physical, sexual, trust and emotional respect and the affects domestic abuse has on children. We also take referrals for women, and if they are assessed as suitable they will be offered 1:1 work. The number of sessions vary from client to client but are usually between 6-8 sessions.

If you are assessed as suitable for the ADAPT programme, we will complete pre-group sessions, while you await a start date for the programme.

The aim of this work is to provide an increased understanding of unhealthy behaviours and we will introduce repeatable tools to help implement change, which can be used as coping strategies for negative emotions.

Our groups are run in Basingstoke. Eastleigh, Havant, IOW and Southampton from 18.15 - 20.15pm on a weekly basis.
