GOMER CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION & NATIVITY After last year's fantastic live performance, we are excited to announce that this year's nativity will again take place at St Mary's Church, Alverstoke, on Tuesday 16 December at 2.00pm. We are so grateful to St Mary's for hosting us. The entire school will perform in the church, and we warmly welcome you to take your seats from 1.40pm. The church has also allowed us to access the Parish Centre which will be used as a backstage area, to shelter the children when they are not performing - they will not all be able to perform all at once due to space limitations. Due to space limitations set by the church, the event will be ticketed. We are able to offer two tickets per family only. If you have yet to order your tickets please access the Google Form. The Google Form and orders for tickets will close at 09.00am on Wednesday 10 December. Tickets will then be sent home directly with your eldest child on Wednesday 18 December. This is a huge undertaking so we are unable to offer flexibility with this. To ensure that everyone enjoys the performance, we kindly ask that toddlers are not in attendance, if possible, as they may become unsettled. The performance will be a joyful combination of carols and songs, with the nativity being narrated throughout. Everyone will have the chance to join in with some carols, making it a truly special experience for all.

All pupils are required to wear a **nativity head-dress to be worn with their school uniform**, unless directed by their teacher, if they have a speaking part. ONLINE SAFETY remains a high priority, so you are encouraged to access our monthly online safety newsletters. Some safeguarding info for you re Roblox... We have been made aware of a pop-up that is appearing on Roblox, encouraging children to download an app called pollybuzz (or pollyfuzz in some spelling cases). The app seems quite simple where children are asked questions, and it generates an Artificial Intelligence 'friend'. This starts quite innocently but then begins to show extreme content (including suicide, self-harm and pornography). It may be helpful to remind children about not clicking on pop-ups in games and to report anything that is worrying or inappropriate to a trusted adult. SUPPORTING CHILDREN USING CUTLERY We have noticed recently that a number of children are finding it difficult to use a knife and fork confidently and correctly. This has become such a common issue that Mrs Mulhall delivered a special assembly a couple of weeks ago to teach and demonstrate the basics of holding and using cutlery. During the assembly, children were shown:

- that the knife is usually held in their writing hand,
- how to hold both pieces of cutlery properly (rather than gripping them with a closed fist), and
- the technique of using the fork in the non-writing hand to steady or 'stab' the food while using the knife to gently 'saw, saw, saw'.

Using cutlery is a fundamental life skill and one that needs regular practice. While we will continue to remind and support children during lunchtime, we are not able to correct every individual habit and some children are beginning to develop poor eating routines as a result. We would really appreciate your help in guiding your child at home by encouraging them to use their knife and fork correctly at mealtimes. And now that they are aged 7-11 avoid using their fingers to eat their hot lunch. Even small amounts of daily practice can make a big difference to their independence, confidence, and table manners. Thank you for your support in helping all our children develop this important everyday skill.

WATER BOTTLES To ensure children stay hydrated and ready to learn, we encourage all pupils to bring a water bottle to school each day. For safety and practicality, we kindly ask that bottles are plastic (not hard screw-top metal) and ideally have a sports-style top to minimise spillages. It's important that water bottles are clearly named and brought home daily for washing to maintain hygiene. Unfortunately, we are unable to provide spare water bottles, so it's essential that every child has one organised from home. We've noticed an increasing number of children requesting bottles during the day, and we need your support in ensuring they come prepared. Thank you for helping us keep the school day running smoothly!

WELLIES are very useful to have at school because without these, the children can not go on the school field in wetter and/or colder months. Please send your child to school with a named pair of wellies or a stout shoe so that they can play on the field on soggy field days. Children are welcome to take them home for the weekend. Not got a pair? This might make for a good Christmas gift idea! Any spares you may have at home are always welcome if no longer needed, these can be added to the boot racks outside classes.
